WHAT IS THE WAR COLLEGE OF THE SEVEN YEARS' WAR?

The War College of the Seven Years' War is a two-day seminar focused on the military and cultural history of North America during the Seven Years' War (French & Indian War). Over 150 participants—people with a deep interest in 18th-century military history—join us each year. The War College provides participants with an opportunity to listen to and interact with the presenters in a relaxed atmosphere.

WHAT DOES THE SCHOLARSHIP INCLUDE?

The Teacher Scholarship to the War College includes:

- ◇ The War College registration fee, enabling you to attend all lecture presentations on Friday evening, Saturday, and Sunday;
