### **10:15 am Guided Tour** (Begins at American Flag)

Learn about the history of Fort Ticonderoga on this 30-minute guided tour.

### **10:30 am Carillon Boat Cruise** (*Carillon* boat dock near the King's Garden)

Explore Ticonderoga's history from the water! Embark on this adventure for an unforgettable experience aboard the *Carillon* cruise vessel. Limited to 35 participants. Additional ticket required and can be purchased inside the Log House Welcome Center.

### **10:40 am Historic Trades Program: Shoemaking** (Ground floor of the Officers' Barracks)

Discover how artisan work and mass-production together made shoes for soldiers and subjects alike. Enjoy the subtle styles of shoe in 1758 and the science of making it fit with our skilled shoemakers. See the many styles of Native American, Canadian, and French shoes found here at Carillon, later named Ticonderoga.

### **11:00 am-1:00 pm Watercolors in the King's Garden** (King's Garden)

Try your hand at Watercolor Paints, while using the beautiful landscapes of the King's Garden as your inspiration. Colored Pencils will also be available with suggestions for painting and drawing.

### **11:00 am Musket Demonstration** (Demonstration Area)

Even in the wilderness, a soldier's world was siege and defense behind earthen or log walls. Discover the muskets of French soldiers and artillerymen and how they worked together to hold their ground.

### **11:30 am King's Garden Tour** (Begins at American Flag)

Learn about the history of the King's Garden and the grounds surrounding the Pavilion.

### **12:00 pm Mid-Day Mess Program** (Camp Kitchen by Fort Archway)

Discover how in the midst of military victory, crop failure spelled real trouble for Canadians and French soldiers alike in 1758.

### **10:00 am-4:30 pm The Heroic Corn Maze: A Corn Maze Adventure!** (Corn Maze by King's Garden)

Explore our unique 6-acre corn maze with a new 2019 design! Getting lost in this life-size puzzle is part of the fun as you look for history clues connected to our epic story among towering stalks of corn! Are you up for the challenge?

### **12:40 pm Historic Trades Program: Carpentry** (Boat Yard by the King's Garden/Pavilion)

A growing French fleet on Lake Champlain supplied the French Army at Carillon in 1758. Learn more about the boat building that made this fleet and how French boat styles influenced generations of vessels in North America.

### **1:00 pm-3:00 pm Soldiers Gardening** (The King's Garden)

The Jardin du Roi (King's Garden) provided French soldiers at Carillon with vital vegetables needed for nutrition. Help the soldiers tend the garden and receive a portion of greens for your own table at home!

**2:00 pm Cannon Firing Demonstration (Demonstration area)**

Artillerymen's work was half art and half science; carefully measuring powder, wadding, and iron cannon balls, to make powerful, perfectly-aimed shots. See how French Artillerymen made the guns of Fort Carillon so formidable.

**2:30 pm Historic Trades Program: Tailoring (2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the Officers' Barracks)**

Explore military and civilian fashion in 1758 as you learn about the trade of tailoring. Discover the subtle differences between French uniforms that proclaimed ranks and regiments. See women's fashions in French Canada and the influence of Native American dress on their attire.
