
If you complete:

Voyage to New France A Family Adventure!



Join Fort Ticonderoga on an adventure for your whole family!

Step into New France in 1758 at Fort Carillon (later named Ticonderoga) and prepare for your time travel as you meet with staff portraying French soldiers. Help the soldiers with their daily duties. Explore Fort Ticonderoga's 2000-acres of historic landscape as history comes to life through exciting programs, historic trades, thrilling weapons demonstrations, family tours and more!

Explore museum exhibits to see the amazing and rare objects from the past and hear stories about France and England's struggle to take North America and how that eventually led to America's fight for independence.

While you explore, be sure to complete enough tasks to earn prizes of historic proportions!

Start in the lower level of the Soldiers' Barracks and receive directions on how to explore the many activities around Fort Ticonderoga! Tasks can be completed in any order. As you complete them, you'll receive an item as proof of your skill. Bring these items back to the Soldiers' Barracks to receive a prize for completing 4, 5, or 6 tasks!

1. Soldiers' Barracks

Harsh weather in North America meant changes in clothing for French soldiers who were accustomed to the milder temperatures of Europe. While visiting the Soldiers' Barracks, create a Tuque, the unique headwear worn by French soldiers serving in North America.

2. Shoe Making

A barefoot army wouldn't be very effective! Visit the Shoe Shop on the first floor of the Officers' Barracks to learn how shoemakers kept the army in good standing order. Watch shoemakers make footwear and equipment for the army and receive a piece of leather!

3. Tailoring

Appearance matters in the French Army. Soldiers must be well dressed and well equipped while they perform their duties. Stop by the Tailor Shop on the Second Floor of the Officers' Barracks to see what goes into clothing a soldier in New France. Learn how soldiers in North America often dressed differently than soldiers in France. Receive a piece of cloth!



4. Musket Maintenance

Soldiers must keep their weapons in proper working order. Enter the lower level of the Officers' Barracks and help a soldier who is on guard duty maintain their musket and learn the different parts that make this weapon work. Receive your own cartridge for helping the soldiers!

5. Carpentry

In order to move supplies from storehouses in Canada to Fort Carillon, the French Army employed hundreds of small boats called bateaux. Visit the storehouse in the King's Garden and help soldiers build a boat! You'll be able to take a peg for yourself!

6. Soldiers' Garden

The *Jardin du Roi* (King's Garden) provided French soldiers at Carillon with vital vegetables needed for nutrition. Help the soldiers tend the garden and receive a portion of greens for your own table at home!

Don't forget to return to the Soldiers' Barracks to retrieve your prize!
