Join Fort Ticonderoga on an adventure for your whole family!

Step into Fort Ticonderoga to meet with staff portraying British soldiers of the 26<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Foot and help them with their daily duties! Explore Fort Ticonderoga's 2000-acres of historic landscape as history comes to life through exciting programs, historic trades, thrilling weapons demonstrations, family tours and more!

Explore museum exhibits to see the amazing and rare objects from the past and hear stories about France and England's struggle to take North America and how that eventually led to America's fight for independence.

While you explore, be sure to complete the following tasks to earn prizes of historic proportions!

### **Kids' Kits**

I spy with my little eye something for everyone! While you explore the fort grounds, keep an eye out for key objects and landmarks with the I-Spy scavenger hunt. Visit the marquee tent to pick up a Kids' Kit, filled with word puzzles, coloring pages, and crayons!

### **Shoemaking**

A barefoot army wouldn't march very far! Visit our shoemakers to learn how they kept the army in good standing order. Watch shoemakers cut and sew leather for their fellow soldiers and receive your own piece of leather!

### **Tailoring**

Appearance matters in the British Army. Soldiers must be well-dressed and comfortably clothed year round. Visit the tailors on the second floor of the Officers' Barracks to see what goes into clothing a soldier in the British Army. Receive a piece of cloth from the tailors to take with you!

### **Musket Maintenance**

Soldiers must keep their weapons in proper working order. Enter the lower level of the Officers' Barracks and help a soldier maintain their musket and learn the different parts

that make this weapon work. Receive your own cartridge for helping the soldiers!

### **Maritime Trades**

In order to move soldiers and supplies up Lake Champlain to Fort Ticonderoga, the British Army employed small boats called bateaux. Visit the storehouse in the King's Garden and help soldiers build a boat, sail, or rigging! You'll be able to take a wooden peg for yourself!

### **Soldiers' Garden**

The King's Garden provided British soldiers at Ticonderoga with vital vegetables needed to stay healthy. Help the soldiers tend the garden and receive a portion of greens for your table at home or a potted seedling for your family garden!

### **Return to the marquee tent with:**

1. ***Completed I-Spy Scavenger Hunt*** and stamp your booklet with the broad arrow that was used to show that an item belonged to the British government!
2. ***A keepsake from one or more of the three locations in the parade ground*** (Tailor Shop, Shoe Shop, Musket Maintenance) and sign Captain William Delaplace's workbook to be counted as a skilled artificer!
3. ***A memento from the King's Garden or Boat Shop*** to receive extra fatigue pay in reproduction currency for all of your hard work!
