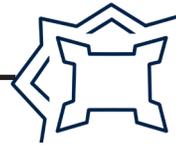


Girl Scout Petals and Journeys

Use Resources Wisely!

Visit the historic trades at Fort Ticonderoga to see how the tailors, carpenters, and shoemakers conserve materials, repair worn out clothing and shoes, and recycle scraps. You can also stop by the camp kitchen to see how soldiers save firewood and ration out food. Talk about what similar things you could do at home or with your troop!

Courageous and Strong!

Ask any of the staff at Fort Ticonderoga about the lives of the men and women they portray! Talk about how life in the 18th century required courage and strength, just like today! When you go home, describe what you would have done in the 18th century at Fort Ticonderoga.

Visit the oxen in their pasture or at work, observe where they live, what they eat, and talk to a staff member to uncover the important roles oxen played at Fort Ticonderoga historically!
