May 4 & 5, 2024**

**Friday**

**2:00 p.m.-11:00 p.m. Registration Open**

Registration will be inside the Fort at the Officer of the Day Room just left of the archway as you enter the fort. Have your car’s color, model and license plate number ready for a parking pass. Please remove vehicles to re-enactor parking in the overflow lot across from visitor parking as soon as possible. Vehicles must be in re-enactor parking before 8:30 a.m. Saturday.

**8:00 p.m. Evening Orders**

All those present will receive their duty assignments for the next day.

**11:00 p.m. Tattoo**

Participants should head back to their tents or quarters for the night.

**Saturday**

**7:00 a.m. Reveille**

**7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. Registration Open**

Any late arrivals should sign-in at registration. All vehicles must be removed to parking no later than 8:30 a.m. Unit commanders should ensure that later arrivals sign-in as well.

**8:30 a.m. Breakfast**

Messes are responsible for cooking and serving breakfast by this time. Oatmeal, milk, and butter are provided beforehand.

**9:00 a.m. NCOs’ call**

NCOs, & Fort Ticonderoga staff will assemble to review duty assignments for the day.

**9:15 a.m. Rations Issued**

Cooks receive rations from the commissary and begin cooking dinner for their respective messes at their designated fires.

**9:30 a.m. Fort Opens to Visitors**

**9:30 a.m. Assembly, Inspection of the Guard, & Exercise**

All participants form on the parade ground for inspection of arms and foot drill.

**10:00 a.m. Guards Mount & Fatigue**

The Sergeant of the Guard will begin the guard rotation for the morning. Participants on fatigue fall in with their respective NCOs to receive instruction and draw tools.

**10:45 a.m. Assemble for Musket Demonstration**

Those soldiers assigned to the musket demonstration should report to the parade for inspection, prior to the 11:00 a.m. public program.

**12:30 p.m. Dinner**

Guards and fatigue parties return to their quarters and put on their full dress uniform. After washing their hands and faces all soldiers, women, and children are to sit down to a completely set table and respectfully enjoy dinner in the company of their messes.

**1:30 p.m. Mount Guard & Fatigue**

The Sergeant of the Guard will begin the guard rotation for the afternoon. Fatigue parties will return to their respective NCOs to receive instruction and draw tools.

**1:45 p.m. Assemble for Cannon Demonstration**

Those soldiers assigned to the cannon demonstration should report to the parade for inspection, prior to the 2:00 p.m. public program.

**4:00 p.m. Exercise**

All participants will form on the parade ground under arms for musket drill.

**5:00 p.m. Fort Closes to Visitors**

**5:30 p.m. Bateau Row**

Participants interested in rowing on Lake Champlain by bateau should assemble on the parade.

**7:30 p.m. Supper**

Messes are responsible for cooking and serving supper by this time. Participants provide their own rations for supper or it can consist of leftovers from dinner.

**8:00 p.m. Evening Orders**

All will assemble to receive their duty assignments for the next day.

**11:00 p.m. Tattoo**

Participants should head back to their tents or quarters for the night.

**2:30 p.m. Prepare to March**

Participants are to begin packing up their equipment and prepare to march out of the fort. The Barracks Master is to inspect each room. Any participants who wish to stay until 5:00 p.m. are welcome to do so.

**3:00 p.m. March Out**

Participants load their equipment on period vehicles and mount packs. They will form on the parade ground in marching order, awaiting orders to march. Once outside the fort participants can load their vehicles and prepare for their departure.
